Kristallnacht Memorial Speech

 On Thursday November 10, the Nasi of TI, Rabbi Hillel Tendler gave the annual Kristallnacht Memorial speech to the TI middle school. Rabbi Tendler started off by explaining the events that led up to Kristallnacht and what had occurred.

On November 9th and 10th, the Austro-Germans started a pogrom. On these days, windows of Jewish businesses were smashed, and possessions of Jewish homes and businesses were destroyed. Hundreds of men, women, and children were killed over these two days. There were laws issued by the German Chancellor that prevented Jewish success and charged one billion German Reichsmarks which is equal to about one million US dollars. This was all “justified” by the killing of a low-ranking German official by a Jew in the German embassy in Paris, France. This night was also the start of the packing of Jews into cattle cars and taking them to the notoriously vicious concentration camps.

Rabbi Tendler spoke about the Asara Harugei Malchus that we say on Yom Kippur and Tish'a B'av. As the Tanaim were being brutally murdered by the Romans, the malachim were asking Hashem: Zu Torah Vezu S'chorah; "This is Torah and this is It's payment?" Hashem answered: If there was to be another sound, He would destroy the entire world into nothingness. He explained that in order for Hashem to explain why it was happening, He would have to destroy the entire world. Why? Because it all comes from the same source, from the creation of the world. So too here, we don't know the reason for what happened in the Holocaust, but we still have to remember what occurred. We know that punishments throughout history come from the Chet Hameraglim and because of how they spoke about Eretz Yisrael. Sixteen of the Forty-four Al Chets are involved with speech. We have to always be careful with our incredibly powerful use of speech.

Torah in the world is booming like never before, despite these tragedies. We as Klal Yisroel also need to display proper middos together with the Torah to show who we are on a deep level. Torah and middos: The two cannot exist properly without each other. Although the Germans were considered to be the most refined people with the best manners, without the Torah to guide them, their manners meant nothing. Eisav will always hate Yaakov; this is an indelible trademark of our lineage and the halacha never changes. We see this ever so clearly: even if one might appear to be refined, we know that the Torah is what truly refines us. We must always remember that our words and actions matter and that we need both Torah, alongside middos tovos to guide us and shape our lives.
