When a person does a chesed for another person it brings a close feeling of friendship between the two of them. The giver feels good about being able to provide for his friend and the recipient feels taken care of by his friend. In your case, your friend is obviously not appreciative of your kindness because he does not show any concern for your belongings and you are only getting frustrated by having to supply him again with something he will lose. Your only choice is to explain to him clearly that you would like to help him out as a friend, but he must be careful to return your items. Hopefully he will understand and you will be able to provide him with genuine chesed.
